Focus and scope

The objective of Biblios Journal is to disseminate works on empirical or theoretical research, related or linked to any of the areas of Information Sciences. This approach covers all areas of these fields without discrimination of any kind. Biblios is open to the submission of articles and research from any person or organization if they meet the criteria described above.

Peer review process

The editors make a [preliminary evaluation](#) of the contributions received where the following aspects are considered:

- a) Originality
- b) Unpublished character
- c) Thematic relevance
- d) Thematic validity
- e) Compliance with editorial standards
- f) General structure

The contributions that are in agreement with those aspects are evaluated by specialists in the area. Biblios preferably adopts the double-blind peer review evaluation methodology. Exceptionally, it applies other forms of evaluation such as single expert review.

Open access policy

This journal provides immediate open access to its content. Our publisher, the University Library System at the University of Pittsburgh, subscribes to the [Budapest Open Access Initiative's definition of Open Access](#):

“By ‘open access’ to this [peer-reviewed scientific literature, we mean its free availability on the public Internet, allowing any user to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or use it for any lawful purpose, without any financial, legal, or technical barriers, outside of those that are inseparable from those involved in accessing the Internet itself. The only limitation on reproduction and distribution, and the only role of copyright in this domain, should be to give authors control over the integrity of their works and the right to be properly acknowledged and cited.”

Researchers engage in this process for the public good, however, due to cost barriers or usage restrictions imposed by other publishers, research results are not available to the entire community of potential users. Our mission is to support greater global knowledge sharing by allowing research published in this journal to be open to the public and reusable according to the terms of the Creative Commons [CC-BY](#) license.

In addition, we encourage authors to pre-publish their manuscripts in institutional repositories or on their websites before and during the process of submitting their papers for review, and to publish the PDF of the final version in the Journal after publication. These practices benefit authors with productive exchanges as well as increased citation of published papers.

There are no article processing fees, submission fees, or any other charges required of authors for submitting their articles to this journal.

Declaration of good ethical practices

BIBLIOS is a publication committed to guaranteeing the quality of its contents and the good exercise of ethical practices by each of its actors. This statement, based on the Guidelines on Good Practices for Publications developed by the [Committee on Publication Ethics \(COPE\)](#), raises a set of ethical issues focused on each of the important elements and roles involved in the editorial process.

1. About the Articles

- 1.1. The data declared in the articles must be real and authentic. All articles must include citations and references to the respective sources.
- 1.2. Plagiarism and fraudulent data in articles under any modality is prohibited. It is considered an unfair practice to submit an article for evaluation to more than one journal. It is considered an unethical practice to publish the same article in more than one journal.

2. About the Author

- 2.1. The presentation of other authors' ideas as one's own is not an acceptable practice.
- 2.2. The authors should report any source of financing that has allowed the study to be carried out, as well as any other commitment that could influence the interpretation of the results.
- 2.3. All authors are obliged to provide the necessary corrections to errors.

3 . About the Reviewers and Peer Review

- 3.1. Peer reviewers should give their opinion objectively and without bias.
- 3.2. Report promptly to the editor any conflict of interest they may detect when reading an article that has been sent for review.
- 3.3. Alert any possible situation of plagiarism in a work, either partially or in an article as a whole. Also indicate if any theoretical source is being used in an article without being cited.
- 3.4. Peer review is a confidential process. Any information of the evaluated articles must be kept in reserve by the evaluators.

4 . About the Editor

- 4.1. It is the responsibility of the editor to evaluate articles without regard to race, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, political belief, nationality, ethnic origin or personal position of the authors.
- 4.2. The editor must decide which articles should be sent for peer review, as well as which are in conditions to be published after review, in addition to preserving the confidentiality of the articles reviewed, not disclosing any information about their content, subject matter, authorship, data included, analysis performed or final conclusions.
- 4.3. It is the editor's responsibility to meet the needs of readers and authors, to constantly improve and innovate the journal, and to ensure the quality of the articles published.
- 4.4. The editor should avoid any conflict of interest with rejected or accepted articles and promote the publication of corrections, clarifications, rectifications and apologies when errors are found and whenever necessary.

5 . About the Editorial Board

- 5.1. The Editorial Board is responsible for monitoring and safeguarding the various aspects of the journal's editorial ethics, resolving any ethical conflict promptly and in coordination with the editor, in order to maintain the integrity and academic credibility of the journal.
- 5.2. The Editorial Board rejects plagiarism and fraudulent data in articles under any modality.
- 5.3. The Editorial Board is willing to publish corrections, clarifications, rectifications and apologies when necessary.

Frequency of publication

Biblios is a publication that adheres to the model of **continuous publication**.

Until 2021, Biblios published quarterly (3 issues per year). During 2022, Biblios opted for semi-annual publication (2 issues per year) and 'online first' mode.

Fees for submission and publication of texts

BIBLIOS does not charge any fee for published texts or for texts submitted for evaluation, review, publication, distribution or download.

Interoperability protocol

BIBLIOS incorporates the OAI-PMH (Open Archives Initiative Protocol for Metadata Harvesting) interoperability protocol that allows it to be harvested by other distribution systems. The electronic address to access is:

History of the magazine

Biblios was created in 1999 in Peru with the purpose of disseminating information on the activities of information professionals, publishing news and opinion articles.

Since 2001, the journal has had a regional scope by publishing research articles on Library and Information Science from various Latin American countries.

In 2007 it became a refereed journal by including peer review in its editorial process.

During the pandemic, the Biblios team had the intention of continuing with the editorial process on a regular basis, and despite the inconveniences, it was possible to publish the articles being evaluated gradually during that period and afterwards.

Currently, Biblios is a recognized publication, with more than twenty years of uninterrupted activity and a constant process of renewal.
